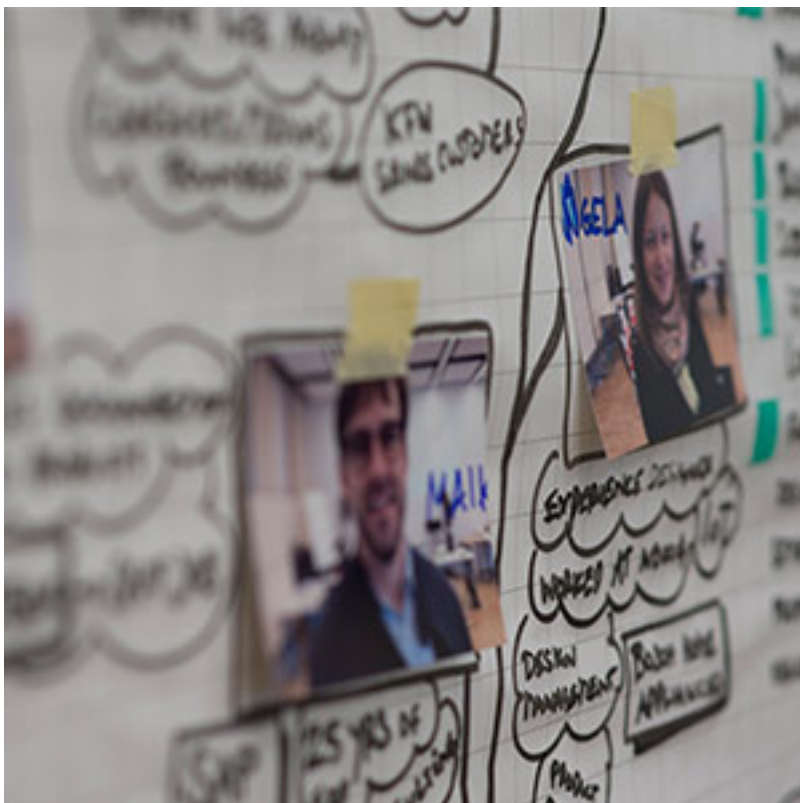

New courses at the Summer University Berlin

New additions this year: A workshop with the blogger and writer of the Schaubühne – Joseph Pearson – who invites participants from July, 25th until August, 2nd to intensively examine a written reflection of the Berlin-metropolis. We also have Susanne Rockweiler as a guest this year. The deputy director of the Martin-Gropius-Bau will give insights into the topic of

fundraising for artists and companies from August, 31st until September, 2nd. Additional to the workshop about business development for creatives, this year the Dark Horse Innovation team also offers a course on alternative leadership strategies from September, 19th until 21st.



Highlight: Music

One of the big highlights of this year's programme is the intensive workshop on "Improvisation" guided by the American composer Shirish Korde together with the Trio Berlin. Under the direction of the ensemble, composers and musicians of all instruments have the possibility to overcome their timidity of free contact with musical material and to test new improvising techniques. In this context, composers can deepen the integration of non-European composition styles into their own work.
